

E-Safety Campaign Week

Following on from the success of our previous two campaigns, 'Show Racism the Red Card' and 'Make a Noise About Bullying,' last half term's student campaign was linked to National 'Safer Internet Day' which was held across the country on Tuesday 6th February.

'Safer Internet Day' is held every February and it is designed to raise awareness of a safer and better internet for all, especially young people.

The Purbeck School fully embraced this campaign and we saw a week long of activities for both tutors and students to take part in.
